I acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 15th instant with its enclosure, the contents of which have been noted.

This case received the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today, when instructions were given for the notation "Surveys overdue - class suspended 2,63" to be entered against the ship's name in the Society's Register Book. Please inform the Owners accordingly.

You may also inform the Owners that for the issue of a Load Line Certificate by the Society to this ship, a survey of hull structure and all freeboard items equivalent to the Special Survey appropriate to the ship's age will require to be carried out and all repairs considered necessary by the Surveyors effected. There will be no difference in survey and repairs whether the period of validity of the Load Line Certificate is two years or the maximum of four years, and the Surveyors will be instructed to keep in view a period of validity of four years when dealing with the case.

When the ship is in drydock, the rudder should be examined and it should be ascertained that the propelling machinery is in efficient condition for mechanical propulsion of the ship.
