Dear Sirs,

3. With reference to your letter of the 16th ultimo respecting the Motorship "ADULIS", I have to acquaint you that in a letter dated the 18th ultimo the Society's Surveyor at Port Said reported that he had specially examined the vessel at Suez and found that she had sustained no damage on the voyage out from this country.

The case has today received the consideration of the Committee and the vessel has accordingly been classed "A-With freeboard, For Service in the Red Sea and North East African Coast" with Docking Date 9,47 Gmh., together with notations of S.S.Gmh.-9,47 and I.M.C. 9,47 in respect of the Special Survey of the hull and machinery. A record of S(N) 9,47 has been assigned in respect of the Screwshaft Survey.

I take this opportunity to refer to a similar case of the "BAHR HAGASH" and to enclose for your information a copy of an Air Mail letter which has today been addressed to the Society's Surveyor at Port Said, the contents of which are self-explanatory. It is concluded you will have no objection to the case of this sister vessel being dealt with on similar lines to those of the "ADULIS".
