Dear Sir,

I duly received your letter of the 22nd instant with enclosures as advised, about the proposed classification with this Society of the s.s. "MARI 11".

The scantlings and arrangements, and equipment, shewn on the plans sent with your letter have been examined, and it is found that they are equivalent to the requirements of the Rules for the class 100A1.

Provided, therefore, the scantlings be verified, the equipment, with suitable certificates, be found to correspond with that shown on the plans, and the requirements of the Rules for Vessels not built under Survey be complied with, the strengthening of the bottom forward and the arrangements to resist panting be to the Surveyors' satisfaction, the vessel will, on completion of the survey and on receipt of a favourable report from the Surveyors, be eligible to be favourably recommended to the Committee for the class 100A1.
