the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owner's Representative, attend the Steel Screw Motor Vessel "BULLINA", 3771 tons gross of LONDON, on the 11th February, 1955 and subsequently, whilst in dry-dock and afloat at Singapore, for the purpose of examining its suitability for being towed to a Mediterranean Port by the Tug.M.V. "CROWLER" (Ex M.V. "CASTLE BRACK").

NOW DONE:-

DOCKING: Vessel in dry-dock, shell, plating and rudder cleaned, examined and found, or placed in satisfactory condition. Weather decks, hatchways, coamings, covers with their battening arrangements, ventilators and air pipes with their closing appliances, casings with their doors and fastenings, Engine Room skylights and fidleys, portlights with their deadlights, scuppers, sanitary discharge valves (as far as practicable without opening up), and guard rails examined and found, or placed in satisfactory condition. Rudder quadrant efficiently secured in the amidship position. Propeller shafting efficiently secured to prevent turning.

The vessel in the foregoing respects, is in the opinion of the undersigned, in satisfactory condition for being towed to a Mediterranean Port.
