Dear Sirs,

With reference to Mr. Kendall's freeboard reports on Messrs. The Dublin Dockyard Co's Yard Nos. 120 and 121, I enclose for his information a memorandum setting forth the freeboards which have been provisionally assigned in each case, subject to the particulars and dimensions now supplied being verified on completion of the vessels.

The usual printed letters giving particulars of the freeboards which have been provisionally assigned to the vessels are being forwarded to the Society's Surveyor at Dublin.

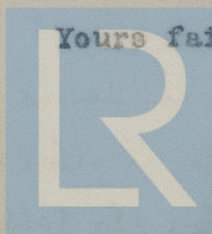
In the case of No. 120, it has been assumed that the moulded depth to the upper deck is 20'-0 $\frac{1}{4}$ " and not 20'-6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " as given on your report, as the moulded depth to the 2nd deck and the height of the tween decks are given as 12'-6" and 1'-6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " respectively.
