In response to the request contained in your letter of the 30th ultimo, I enclose you a further statement prepared by Mr. Winders which, I think, covers all the points you raise.

My first impression when Mr. Winders reported the case to me was that a speed of nearly 10 knots is high for a vessel of this type and may be the answer to the apparently excessive flexibility. If the voyage to Falmouth was made at a reduced speed it may be that the deflection was not so noticeable.
