


s.s. "OAKLEY"

This ship was originally built to class ~~1004K~~ ~~E~~ with Germanischer Lloyd. This class is for service between all harbours of Europe, Mediterranean and Black Sea and overseas voyages in similar waters.

The plans were approved by the British Corporation for class BS (Coasting Service), but as the Lloyd's Register practice of defining the service limits in the Register Book in the same manner as on the loadline certificate is now being followed in all cases of ships coming into B.C. class, the class of the "OAKLEY" as originally proposed will require to be amended to follow the practice.

It is submitted the Newcastle Surveyors be informed that the plans of this ship were originally approved by the British Corporation for class BS (Coasting Service) but it will now be necessary to define the service limits more accurately for insertion in the Register Book. The Owner should therefore be requested to furnish for the consideration of the Society particulars of the proposed service.
