Dear Sir,

With further reference to our letter of the 8th instant relative to the Steamer "OAKLEY", we have had some discussion with Mr. Bainbridge of Messrs. Anthony & Bainbridge, and with regard to the outstanding fees, he states that Messrs. Harris & Dickson Ltd. were first mortgagees on this vessel before she was sold by the Admiralty Marshall. And, further, that the Bill of Sale from the Admiralty Marshall was "free of encumbrances." He expects to be in London early this week and proposes to call in the London Office to discuss the position.

In the meantime we have agreed to do some preliminary facilitating items of survey so as to avoid holding up progress on the ship. At the same time, as this is contrary to our written instructions, it will be realised we cannot well go further in the matter.

Mr. Bainbridge stated he was in the first instance proposing to carry out the Special Survey in full, and it has occurred to me that, if this takes place, he might, in these circumstances, be willing to pay the full fees for classification and survey, in which case the Committee might be prepared to waive the outstanding British Corporation fees, as allowance would normally be made for these if they were paid, and it does not appear that any official report was made ^{by} the British Corporation at the time of charging them.

It might be thought desirable to put this to him, but if this were done, the amounts involved should be clearly defined so far as this is possible. It is understood he may call in the London Office on Wednesday morning and the ship may be in drydock on Thursday, so that it is very desirable that some decision should be arrived at and this Office informed.
