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Dear Sir,

With reference to the attached notice intimating that the Steamer "OAKLEY" is now to be sold by public auction, we have to advise you that we have been approached by a prospective purchaser as to the items requiring to be dealt with to entitle this vessel to classification.

Reverting to your letter of the 28th September last, it is to be noted that this ship has practically been laid up, with little maintenance, since last March when classification matters were handed over at the time of the fusion with the British Corporation. Practically no survey work at all has been done since then.

The B.C. Surveyor forwarded a report to Glasgow covering the work done by them and it is a question whether, after this lapse of time, this part of the survey can be safely accepted as it stands.

We shall be glad to be advised, having this in view, what it is considered will now be necessary for full classification and in this regard mention the following.

1. Equipment. It would appear that the cables are considered satisfactory but that the anchors, at least, are to be verified with certificates and in accordance with Rule requirements. *Agree*
2. The load line survey necessary would seem to be a renewal survey. *Agree*
3. The survey of the Boilers and Machinery would seem to have to be repeated, or as found necessary on further examination. *repeated & part of machinery as found necessary*

There are in addition a number of outstanding items which remained to be done in March to complete the B.C. survey, and these would appear to necessitate a general examination of the ship and machinery. *Agreed*


