Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 14th June regarding the motor tanker "CARNARO" and note that this vessel has now been salvaged and is being repaired in the Naples district.

With regard to your concluding paragraph on the question of fees, this case will have to be treated as a first Classification Survey in accordance with the arrangements detailed in my letter of the 14th March last. Such fee, however, will not be chargeable until the survey of repairs is completed by the Naples Surveyor, and in this connection I have already instructed the Society's Genoa Office that a Senior Ship and Engineer Surveyor from that port should join the local Surveyor periodically. There will, of course, be an additional charge of a special damage fee to be considered in this case when the extent of it is known but in any case the final apportionment of the total fee charged as between Naples and Genoa will be a matter for separate consideration on completion of the work.
