M/T. "CARNARO".

We are enclosing herewith for the information of the Committee free translation of a letter received from Messrs. Societa' Italiana di Armamento "SIDARMA" of Venice, requesting the Society's survey during repair of their Motor Tanker "CARNARO" with a view to classification.

This vessel, which is the first of a series of three tankers ("Carnaro", "Illiria" & "Liburnia") built during the war under survey of the Society's Surveyors acting as Owners' superintendants, has been torpedoed & afterwards sunk in Naples Harbour in September 1943. The F.E. Reports were retained at Trieste pending reception of reliable information regarding the fate of the vessel. The Trieste Surveyors will be now requested to forward same to London.

In view of the importance of the repairs the Naples Surveyor has been informed that the Senior Ship & Engineer Surveyors from this port will join him periodically in the survey.


