Dear Sirs,

In reply to your letter of the 13th instant,
I am directed to inform you that, provided all the conditions
of assignment are complied with, the summer freeboards of
the vessels enumerated by you could be reduced under the
terms of the International Loadline Convention of 1930, by
approximately the following amounts:- "CLYMFIELD"
13 inches, "GRATFIELD" 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, "GILFIELD" 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches,
"SYLVAFIELD" 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, "TYNEFIELD" 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

In the case of the "GILFIELD" it is assumed that
there is an enclosed bridge 33.0 feet in length.

With regard to the diagrams forwarded with your
letter, I have to inform you that it is observed that these
show the present arrangements in the vessels, and that no
suggestions are made towards complying with the requirements
of the Convention. These matters will be considered when
the Convention is ratified.

The above mentioned diagrams are being retained.
