EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR Gen.Exam.for postpon. of SS.due 4/58 until 4/59, DS., Damage & Repairs.

Examination of repairs effected at Suez Dec/56 to April/57 - see Secretary letters 16/7 and 24/10/57.-

Bottom shell cleaned as required.- The following shell repairs, stated to have been effected at Suez during the period Dec/56 to April/57, have now been specially examined in dry dock, tested as required and considered satisfactory.

The damage was stated to have been sustained by a mine explosion, while the vessel was at Suez in Oct/56.†

Shell plates :-all numbered from aft. Renewed, Port Side : Keel W.9,A.8,B.8,C.5,6,7,D.4 & 5,E.10,F.11, G.10,H.10,J.10,K.10,and L.11.- Renewed, Stard' Side : Keel 8,13,14,15, A.8,13,14,15, B.7,8,13,14, C.7,13, D.4,5, E.part 11,17,18,19, F.part 10,11,16,17,18, G.part 10,13,14, & part 15, H.10,13, J.10,13,K.10,10, L.11 and 15.- Internals in way appear to have been satisfactorily dealt with.-

Owners repairs.- Shell plate G5, numbered from ford', stard' side, fractured - now renewed.

General Examination.- Vessel generally examined in dry dock, including peaks, double bottom in machinery spaces and cargo tanks, and found satisfactory. It is submitted that the Owners' proposal to postpone the Special Survey due April/58. may be postponed until April/59.

Special Reasons List.Slight pitting in E & F strakes (p.s.) to be specially examined at next dry docking. This part specially examined and found to remain efficient. The item may remain as at present.

Indented shell plate E.4 (s.s.a) to be repaired by next SS.- This plate examined and found to remain efficient. This item may remain as at present.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS, OPINION AND RECOMMENDATION AS TO CLASS

This vessel is eligible, in my opinion, to remain as classed with fresh record of DS. 3/58., Subject: o slight pitting in E and F strakes (p.s.) being specially examined at next dry docking, and indented shell plate E.4 (s.s.a) being repaired at next SS., but without condition regarding damage repairs effected Dec 4/57, and to bottom, being specially cleaned.
