With reference to the case of the above named Tug, I have to inform you that a report of survey held by the Antwerp Surveyors at Ghent in August/November, 1949, has now been received and that the Tug is eligible for a class of '100.A1, For River and Harbour Towing Services', with notation of S.S. 11,49, when a report is received stating that she has been examined on arrival at a West African port and found to be satisfactory, also that the open floors and bottom plating have been coated, as required by the Rules.

It is understood that the Owners, Messrs. Taylor Woodrow (West Africa) Ltd., have informed their Agents at Takoradi of the matters requiring attention and it is therefore concluded the Tug is destined for that port.

Should you be likely to visit Takoradi at an early date, I shall be obliged if you will endeavour to contact the local Agents, and arrange for a report to be forwarded here after carrying out the necessary inspection. Alternatively perhaps you will kindly communicate with Lloyd's Agents at Takoradi and request them to endeavour to arrange for the necessary survey to be held and for a report to be forwarded to this Office.
