You will observe from the Register Book that the shaft in question has not been seen by the Society's Surveyors since the vessel was built.

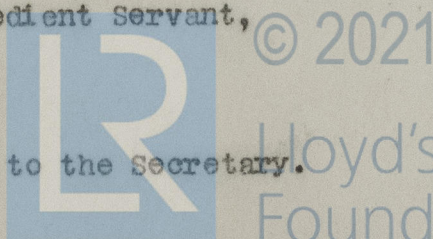
