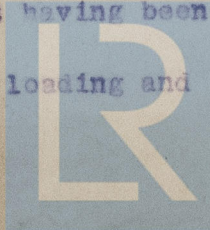

McMillan & Son, Ltd., Dumbarton, and that the Hull, Machinery, Electric Light, and other equipment, have been constructed in accordance with the requirements of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, and that all materials and workmanship are good, and the undersigned will recommend that the vessel be classed with Lloyd's Register of Shipping as follows:- "100A1" with freeboard", "Carrying Petroleum in bulk", "Longitudinal framing", 3,18 and S.L.M.C. 3,18. "Fitted for oil fuel, flash point above 150° F."

The whole of the work and tests covered by the specifications and drawings, as well as the alterations and additions subsequently approved by the Admiralty, have been carried out and completed to the satisfaction of the undersigned.

The Admiralty Officers are responsible for the stipulations of the contract having been complied with so far as regards the horse power, loading and stability, as well
