
This vessel was under survey at Genoa from December 1949 to March 1950 when damage repairs were effected and the Special Survey partly held.

At a preliminary examination of the shell plating at that time it was noted that a considerable number of shell plates were reduced in thickness, and the Surveyors recommended that apart from the normal drilling, additional drill testing would be required. Some temporary repairs were effected by welded doublings, but there still appears to be considerable repairs outstanding.

In view of the proposal to defer the completion of the survey until next October it is considered that before this be granted a thorough General Examination should be made, and particular attention given to the shell plating; drill testing as deemed necessary by the Surveyors should be resorted to, and all essential repairs effected to their satisfaction.

In view of the age of the vessel and her condition as reported by the Genoa Surveyors great care should be exercised in carrying out the inspection.

IT IS SUBMITTED the GENOA Surveyors should be informed accordingly and an appropriate fee should be charged for the services rendered.
