Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th instant and telegram of today relative to the assignment of Convention Freeboards to the steamers "VASCO" and "CELTA" belonging to Mr. M.M. de Pinillos of Cadiz, and in confirmation of my telegram in reply this afternoon, as below, I have to inform you that Convention Freeboards have not been assigned to these vessels by Lloyd's Register, and in the circumstances I regret to say that this Society cannot undertake to carry out any Freeboard Survey on these ships without the consent of the Assigning Authority, which it is assumed in these cases is the Spanish Government Authorities.
