Port Anchor:

Port Anchor removed and secured to deck as spare.  
New Baldt Stockless Anchor, of a weight of 6000 pounds, certified by the American Bureau of Shipping, Certificate No. 53 PA 11116, Philadelphia, Pa., was installed, together with new Pear Shaped Link, American Bureau Certificate No. 53 PA 11117, Philadelphia, Pa.

The forgoing repairs were carried out by the Lago Oil and Transport Co. Ltd. San Nicholas, Aruba, during the annual Drydocking of the Vessel, examined by the undersigned and found satisfactory.
