GROUNDING: It was stated that the vessel had grounded Palembang 6th March 1961 and was refloated with assistance of tugs.

Vessel examined in dry dock & afloat and bottom found in good condition.

The vessel is now being sold to the Bulgarian State line (NAVIGATION MARITIME BULGARE) and Port of registry will be VARNA, the new name of the vessel has not yet been decided.
