

Translation of letter dated 15th January from Societe Anonyme
Ossude, of Paris.

Dear Sirs,

Re "ROCKBREAKER VII."

With reference to our letter of the 27th December, your Paris Office have communicated with us informing us that it is necessary for us to give our consent to enable your Surveyors to attend on board.

We wrote the same day to the Whites Shipyard at Itchen, Southampton, where the vessel is lying, requesting them to communicate with you.

To enable us to obtain the necessary currency for the payment of these repairs it is essential that we should have a pro-forma invoice made out by the Whites Shipyard for the total amount of the costs of the repairs.

We would emphasise that we are requesting this Yard to act as our representatives for this survey and for the execution of the repairs, once these have been defined.

We hope that this information will enable you to examine this question in conjunction with Messrs. Whites Shipyard and we shall be glad if you will arrange to have your fees for this survey included in the amount of the invoice to be drawn up by the Whites Shipyard so as to save us having to make two separate applications for transfer.
