Dear Sir,

Although Mr. NOBLE said to me, very friendly, that he quite agreed with me, I heard he is not pleased at all, and intends to complain when he goes back to London; so you will probably hear from H.B. Mylchreest and C^o Stevinson House, 154-156, Fenchurch Street, Marine Consultants.

1^o-Mr. NOBLE is complaining about my interference.

I send to you, herewith enclosed, the translations of my letter to M. RAILLARD & Sons, Agents of the Owners, and their reply.

I confirm the "Inspecteur de la Navigation" could not deliver his leaving license without a certificate from the Lloyd's Surveyor.

2^o- He says I delivered the certificates before the work finished.

The vessel was undocked on the 19th, and the only things left were few wooden covers to adjust on some small hatchways, doors or windows. The tug was due for the 24th and the 1st part was expected to leave on the 25th. I wrote temporary certificates on the 21th in order, the "Inspecteur de la Navigation" to get a translation on the 23^d and avoid any delay. My definitive certificates were typed on the 22^d and posted on the 23^d, and dated: 20th August 1948, date of my last visit.

Now, the Owner, Mr. GRAM, thinks the fees I asked for, are too high. I asked 28 000 frs for the hull and 7 000 for the machinery surveys.
