M.V. "AESOPOS" ex. "LUCERNA"

We refer to your letter dated 30th April and addressed to Messrs. Aegis Shipping (London) Ltd., concerning the above named vessel.

We now have to advise that the vessel was drydocked in Syra on 6th and 7th May in accordance with the purchase agreement between H.E. Moss & Co. and Messrs. Manguardia Compania Naviera S.A. of Panama, a copy of which was forwarded by the Principal Surveyor in Liverpool. No defects were found.

At the verbal request of the purchaser, and on the authority of the above mentioned letter, a General Examination was commenced at the same time with a view to recommending 12 months postponement of the Special Survey due June 1964.

The ship subsequently returned to Piræus on 8th May but despite repeated enquiries, the further services of a surveyor were not requested. We have now heard unofficially that the vessel is to be transferred to American Bureau class and although we have asked the Owner to confirm this in writing he has not done so to date.

At the sellers' request, we issued an interim certificate to him in respect of the docking survey only. No report has yet been submitted as it was understood that the survey was not yet complete and it was intended that the report should ultimately have two relevant certificates, one for the seller and an amplified one for the Purchaser.

Under the circumstances, we would be pleased to receive your instructions as to how to proceed in this matter in view of the new owners apparent intentions and the possibility of their disclaiming financial responsibility for that part of the General Examination which has been carried out.
