I refer to your memorandum of the 5th instant and now give below the context of a letter which was received from the Society's Surveyor at Baltimore regarding this matter:-

"Mr. Robb of the Shell Canadian Tankers, Ltd. has stated he will inform our Montreal office of the date and details of the sale when conclusion has been reached.

In the meantime the vessel has been examined in drydock by an American Bureau of Shipping surveyor at the request of C. P. Stuber & Co., Inc., the New York agents acting on behalf of Antilles Shipping Co., Inc.

We understand that it would be the new Owner's intention to tow the vessel to Europe for jumboizing.

Regarding these proposed repairs, it is understood from the representative of C. P. Stuber & Co., Inc. that the Antilles Shipping Co., Ltd. may later request Lloyd's Classification but this would, in any case, be on arrival of the vessel in Europe."

The interested parties have been approached regarding retention of class, but unfortunately without success.

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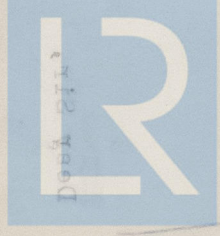
