Dear Sir,

We would refer you to your memorandum of the 25th instant in connection with the drydocking of the above vessel.

The Owners have now written to say that it is their intention to allow the classification of this vessel with the Society to lapse, as she is used only in service on the River Humber and tributaries.

Messrs. J.W. Cook & Co., Ltd., have also informed us that they do not wish to retain the class of the following vessels:-

The first three named will of course be surveyed by the Society's Surveyors to the former Aire and Calder Navigation requirements.

We understand that it is the Owners standing practice to have their vessels constructed to Lloyd's Register requirements and then allow the class to lapse.

Perhaps, therefore, you will kindly arrange for the above cases to be dealt with as necessary.
