DJAWATAN PELAJARAN VESSELS.

Dear Sir,


A few months ago, it was still impossible to obtain any definite statement or promise with regard to surveys on ships managed by the Djawatan Pelajaran.

The general rumour was that all vessels would be taken out of class (L.R. and B.V.). At the Ministry of Shipping it was stated that indeed such a step had been under consideration for some time, but that no decision had been made. I then applied continuous pressure to the people in charge of various departments, resulting in a number of vessels being submitted for survey. One of these ships, the "Bango" was very much overdue and was relieved by another vessel and directed to Surabaia.

Yesterday I met Mr. Jacobs on his way to Kobe and learned that the "Bango" is indeed at Surabaia, but that no survey is being held, following a statement by the local representative of the Djawatan Pelajaran that all vessels are to be taken out of class.

Today I paid a visit to the Ministry of Shipping and Djawatan Pelajaran Head Office. It was stated that no such decision had been made. In view of this, it becomes a matter of conjecture, from which sources Mr. van 't Hert, the Djawatan Pelajaran's Surabaia representative, obtained his instructions.

It might be of further interest to know, that in the course of today's and previous discussions with the Heads of Departments, it became quite clear, that closing
