This vessel appears to have been built in accordance with the Rules and the approved plans, and it is submitted she is eligible to be classed ~~100A1~~ "With Freeboard" midship, and forward deep tanks, "Carrying Fuel oil F.P. above 150°F. in peaks, and forward deep tanks" "Carrying vegetable oil in after deep tank".

The Summer Freeboard as shown on the attached extract from the Freeboard Verification Form, now marked on the vessel's sides, to be inserted in the classification certificate and recorded in the Register Book, and further, the remaining freeboards, as shown on the accompanying extract, to be inserted in the certificate of classification.

Note for S.R.L:-

Fuel oil ^{is} not to be carried in fore and after peak tank when vegetable oil is being carried in the adjoining deep tanks.

When fuel oil is to be carried in the double bottom, and vegetable oil is carried in the D.F. immediately above, care is to be taken that the loading of the fuel oil is stopped before the tank top is under pressure.
