RECOMMENDED.

Port Side.

Shell plate F.1 slightly indented between frames in two places.

Several rivets in Fore peak Bulkhead, shell and deck slack.

Port side of wood chain locker Bulkhead charred.

7 Single Sheave blocks ( for 3" rope) destroyed.

Removals to be made as necessary for access to repairs and afterwards replaced.

All new and disturbed work to be coated.

To be faired in place.

Rivets in vicinity of damage to be tested and renewed as found necessary.

To be renewed.

To be replaced.
