



Part Electrically Welded.

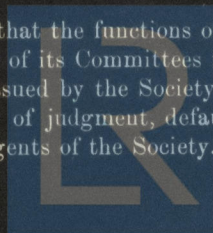
