Dear Sir:

We have your letter of 25th July, 1957 inquiring as to how this case now stands.

I have to advise that on 24th June, 1957 in company with Mr. Lindstrom, from Nassau, representing the owners, the steering arrangements were satisfactorily tried out which is the only outstanding item on the Interim Certificate.

At the same time a short trial trip was held and the propelling machinery, which was installed at this port, found to work satisfactorily.

The pumping arrangements have to be tested and it is considered that the electrical installation should again be megger tested before the ship sails.

The repairers here understand that the delay in the vessel's departure is due to the fact that the landing piers at Nassau are not yet ready for operation and might not be for some time yet.

Mr. Lindstrom at his last visit informed us that when the vessel leaves she will proceed down the Chesapeake Bay to Norfolk, Virginia, thence via the inland canals to Miami, Florida and then across to Nassau in the Bahamas.
