working parts were opened up and found in good order. It is therefore recommended that this vessel

be assigned the record of 4LHC (with date) in the Register Book, subject to the engine being in

aboard the vessel and all remaining requirements of the Rules, including those relating to torsional

vibration characteristics being carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyors.
