This is to Certify that I have surveyed part of the machinery of the S.S. "MUSWELL HILL" 7131 Gross tons of London for part General Examination for extension of class on 26th December, 1962 and subsequently whilst vessel was lying afloat in Penang Harbour

and that all my recommendations have been carried out to my satisfaction. I am reporting accordingly and recommending to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping that the machinery classification should be retained and the following survey records assigned the Machinery be continued as now classed subject to electric circuits being disconnected from holds and forward stores until circuits has satisfactory megger readings and General Examination completed at Rangoon.

Parts now examined:—

All pumps in engine room seen working - Good
Main Engine seen running - Good
Boilers examined under steam - Good as far as seen
steering Gear seen working - Good
Windlass examined externally - Good
Megger readings taken to lighting and fan circuits were low 10,000 to 15,000 ohms.
