CONTINUOUS SURVEY

REPAIRS OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE FOR Annual Survey.

Vessel placed on slipway. Bottom and rudder cleaned, examined and recoated. Rudder removed. Examined decks, hatches and hatchways, ventilators and coamings, casings, superstructure bulkheads, windlass, steering gear (hand) and general equipment. Fore peak tank tested. Freeboard marks verified.

Repairs for Wear and Tear. Shell plate "A" 2 on port side found doubled. Doubler removed, plate dropped and part renewed.

Overhung sternframe solepiece, found set up and twisted slightly (Master states no record of grounding), heated and faired. Both rudder pintles and bushes renewed.

Endorsement:- The indentations on shell plating, p. and s., specially examined and found to continue efficient.
