Nature of Survey S.S. for Classification When due.....

This vessel was originally built in American as an L.S.T.

She is now owned by the Texas Oil Co. of Venezuela for commission to an Oil Tanker.

Classification with this Society is desired.

The Scantlings and arrangements for the conversion, as above, have been examined in the New York Office and found to be suitable for the class A- "With Freeboard" "Carrying Petroleum in Bulk", "No. 8. Tank above 150°F", "For Coastwise Service Cristobel to Para and adjacent Islands".

The GALVESTON Surveyor in a First Entry Report, and Rpt. 8, reports 8.48, the vessel examined in dry dock and afloat, the scantlings and arrangements verified, and the requirements of a Special Survey complied with.

The alterations for conversion, as above, carried out in accordance with the approved plans.
