(Change of Particulars & Classification)

The above named tanker which had been LAID UP - SURVEYS OVERDUE, changed ownership, flag, etc. and was towed to Todd Galveston Shipyard and placed on drydock yesterday.

I had previously been informed by the local surveyor to the Bureau Veritas that he had been attending the ship afloat at Port Arthur, Texas at the request of the new Owners with a view to the V. issuing a temporary certificate for a loaded voyage to Germany.

Today I had an interview with the technical representative of the new owners, Mr. Eggers who confirmed the following change of particulars and that they do not desire to retain the Society's classification.

New Owner	WEITERT, JUERGEN TANKREEDEREI, HAMBURG 20, Germany
New Port of Registry	HAMBURG
New flag	German
Classification	BUREAU VERITAS

The vessel is not expected to leave the Shipyard until about 25th inst. and Mr. Eggers stated that the further necessary permanent repairs will be carried out upon arrival at Germany.

To enable the vessel's classification to be dealt with promptly necessary the original of this letter is being airmailed direct "The Secretary", London.

It may be added that I was not previously consulted or my attendance on board requested at any time.
