MOTOR SHIP "YEN MEN"

We are in receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant together with copy of a letter from London in connection with the above mentioned vessel, and in reply we beg to state that the cargo port doors and side scuttles were constructed in accordance with the approved plans, but the openings in shell were not cut prior to vessel sailing for China it having been arranged that the fitting of Cargo port doors and side scuttles would be carried out at Shanghai.

The webs supporting the side shell were not reinforced for the extended service of - "For Coasting Service between Shanghai and Ports in the China Sea".

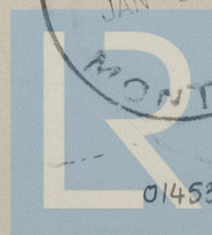
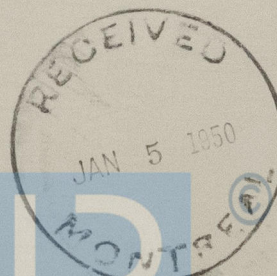
The Cargo port doors and side scuttles were shipped to China on board each of the vessels.
