Vessel left the Clyde on 9th December 1927, for coaling at Dakar. When she sailed, she had three weeks' coal on board.

Nothing has since been heard of the vessel, which was posted at Lloyd's as 'Missing' on the 29th February.

The usual casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 2nd March, but no reply has been received.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

LADY COMBE (dredger).—London, Jan. 5.—The following advices have been received from the builders of the dredger Lady Combe, dated Jan. 4:—As the vessel left the Clyde on Dec. 9 for coaling at Dakar, and in view of the abnormally bad weather experienced in the Atlantic, we are very anxious now about the safety of the vessel. She had three weeks' coal on board and it is now considerably more than three weeks since she sailed.

MISSING VESSEL.

LADY COMBE (dredger).—London, Feb. 29.—Dredger Lady Combe, of Lagos, 509 tons gross, master Flett, which left the Clyde on Dec. 9, 1927, for Dakar, was to-day posted at Lloyd's as a missing vessel.
