I am in receipt of your letters of the 8th and 10th instant regarding these vessels and am obliged to you for your comments.

The cases have been submitted to the Committee today who are hesitant to assign a red line to these new ships, but do not feel they can consistently give instructions for three dots to be recorded in the Register Book seeing that you have been unable to obtain a formal intimation from the Owners that they wish to withdraw class.

The Committee have instructed me to cable you as follows:-

"BAHIA THETIS ETCETERA REURLETTERS 8TH AND 10TH INSTANT PLEASE GIVE FINAL NOTICE MINISTRY IN EVENT THEY IMMEDIATELY FORMALLY REQUESTING WITHDRAWA CLASS THREE DOTS WILL BE ASSIGNED OTHERWISE LIKELY CLASS EXPUNGED RED LINE STOP PLEASE CABLE FOR COMMITTEE NEXT FRIDAY"

and in the event of no formal notice being received by you from the Ministry before Friday next, the Committee will feel they have no alternative but to record a red line in each case.
