Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 28th ultimo regarding the steamer "AGULHAS", and have to say that due note has been made of the request from the Shipping Department, South African Railways, for advice to be given them of any failure on the part of the buyers to maintain the ship in accordance with our recommendations.

So far as the question of the outstanding fees in the case of the "ALI WAL" is concerned, it is considered that you should arrange for the Surveyors in South Africa to satisfy themselves in regard to the settlement of fees for surveys on the "AGULHAS" before any inspection is undertaken. Perhaps it might be as well to make a further approach to the Owners for the outstanding fees for the "ALI WAL" to be settled, seeing that the "AGULHAS" is under their control and is to be maintained in class this may well be a suitable opportunity to state they will doubtless wish to re-establish good relations with this Society.
