With further reference to your letter of the 11th January regarding the case of the above vessel, I have now discussed the matter with Dr. Soldà of the Registro Italiano, who, I may say, was rather surprised and disturbed to learn the facts as given in your memorandum. As a result of our discussion, Dr. Soldà has now sent a cable to the Registro Italiano Representative at Durban requesting him to withdraw immediately the Provisional Classification Certificate issued for voyage Durban to Cape Town.

Dr. Soldà informed me that the facts of this case as known by him prior to our meeting of yesterday were briefly the following:-

Their Durban Representatives wrote stating that the Owners had requested classification of the ship with Registro Italiano and that it was proposed to bring the ship from Durban to Cape Town, at which latter Port the Classification Survey and repairs would be done, but that certain repairs would be necessary prior to leaving Durban before a provisional certificate could be issued for the voyage Durban to Cape Town.

Registro Italiano cabled their representative that this would be in order provided the necessary repairs were carried out at Durban to allow the ship to proceed to Cape Town for full classification Survey and also asked their Representative to forward Reports.

The R.I. Representative then replied that certain repairs to rudder and steering gear, and Temporary Repairs to D.B. Tanks, Forecastle deck had been completed and the Main Engines and Boilers examined and that the ship was considered efficient for the voyage to Cape Town and also asked authorisation to issue a certificate.

No Report on the Survey held at Durban by the Registro Italiano Surveyor has so far been received at the R.I. Head Office.

Dr. Soldà has promised to keep me informed of any further developments in this case and I shall of course advise you of any information received.
