

I have learned that Mr. A.E. Robinson of Messrs. Hean and Robinson, who represent the American Bureau of Shipping in this port, was approached, with a view to his issuing a certificate for this proposed voyage to Cape Town, but on his applying to New York, he was informed that this could only be done if the Owners were prepared to submit the vessel for a full Classification Survey. At the moment, the vessel is still lying in Durban. I will keep you informed of the position.
