The remarks of the Chief Ship Surveyor are desired on this case for the consideration of the Classing Committee.

("The endorsement to contain a succinct summary of any repairs that have been required and to show the cause or causes of such repairs, and also to bring out clearly any exceptional features in connection with the case, so that the Classing Committee may have all the salient points presented in the endorsement."—Extract from Sub-Committee's Report, 24/5/52.)

A PERIODICAL SPECIAL SURVEY (A) became due 8.48.

A much overdue report ^(11.48) has now been received from the AMSTERDAM Surveyors from which it is seen the vessel was placed in dry dock, bottom examined and found in good condition.

It is stated that the ownership has now changed.

The main engine has been shifted three frame spaces aft.

The vessel is now laid up, and deckhouses and engine casings partly dismantled. It is stated the Special Survey will be carried out prior to the vessel being placed in service.

IT IS SUBMITTED a record of docking 11.48 be assigned and the notation "Laid up pending Survey" be inserted in the Register Book.
