With reference to your letter dated 4th September, 1945, M, regarding the continuation of supervision of Swan Hunter's Ship No.1689, the tanker "OLNA" for classification purposes, I have to inform you that this vessel, which has been operating under the White Ensign, is expected to arrive in the Tyne about 28th January, 1946 for docking and repairs at the works of Messrs. Swan Hunter and Wigham Richardson, Ltd., Wallsend-on-Tyne.
