In reply thereto, I have to inform you that vessels of the "Castle" type of Admiralty Trawler were built to plans mutually approved by this Society and the British Corporation.


In order that this vessel may be classed with this Society, it will be necessary for you to carry out a Special Survey on the ship and her engines and boilers to verify the Scantlings as far as possible, and to forward First Entry Reports on hull and machinery duly filled in.

Plans of midship section and profile, and main Boilers of the "Castle" type of Trawler are being forwarded under separate cover for your information and guidance, and should be returned to this Office as soon as done with.
