He is now on the Middlesbrough Staff so that the full history of the occurrence cannot be ascertained.

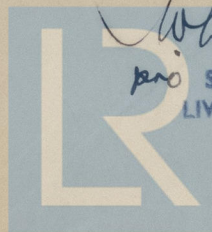
