 LUCIANO CASTRO. — Rio Grande, Apr. 25.—Motor vessel Luciano Castro: We confirm ashore near Chui Light-house in Brazilian waters on voyage to Buenos Aires with cargo believed mainly timber. No details available but owner proceeding Chui to-morrow and returning Rio Grande same day, when will report to us. — Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association. (Note.—Luciano Castro was reported on Apr. 25 aground Chui Light, Uruguayan border, 110 miles south of Rio Grande, while on voyage from Florianopolis to Buenos Aires with cargo of timber.)

 LUCIANO CASTRO. — Rio Grande, Apr. 27. — Motor vessel Luciano Castro reported about 150 yards from beach and totally gutted by fire, including timber cargo. Fire started in engine-room but origin unknown. Hull broken open both sides at No. 2 hatch and forepart of hull out of alignment with catwalk. — Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.
