I duly received the copy of your letter of the 24th ultimo respecting the Classification Certificates of the steel twin screw motor ship "AGUILA", the original of which, together with the certificates advised therein, appears to have been lost in the post, and in the circumstances a fresh Certificate on the hull has now been prepared, with the name of the Owners indicated thereon as desired, and the same is enclosed herewith to be handed over in due course.

It is noted that your letter advises certificates, and it is therefore concluded that the machinery certificate was forwarded together with that on the hull, and it has been thought advisable to send also a fresh certificate for the machinery although the Owners' name does not appear thereon.

Should the original machinery certificate not have been forwarded with your letter of the 24th ultimo, you will be good enough to return the one now sent.

In the event of the original hull certificate being found the same should at once be returned to this Office for cancellation.

I have at the same time to enquire whether any further information resulted from the enquiries which you have
