Dear Sirs,

I return herewith one set of the plans, forwarded (in duplicate) with Mr. Macdonald's letter of the 22nd instant, of the six "CASTLE" Class Steel Screw Admiralty Trawlers to be built by Messrs. C. Pennoldsen & Co., their Nos. 201/206, and with regard thereto I have to inform you that provided the scantlings and arrangements as shown and amended be adhered to, the Rules in all other respects be complied with, and the materials and workmanship be to your satisfaction, the vessels will be eligible to be classed 100A1 "Steam Trawler".

At the same time you should point out to the Builders that, in view of the beams being fitted on every frame, these may be reduced to .30 in thickness and the deck plating may be reduced to .28 in thickness fore and aft, excepting under winch and windlass, as indicated on the plans.

The duplicate plans are being retained in this Office for reference.
