Dear Mr. Macmillan,

Reference our conversation by telephone yesterday and London office letter dated 30th September last, regarding "EMMY FRIEDERICH", I have today interviewed Mr. Friederich. Your letter of the 24th September was referred to and Mr. Friederich now stated that he did not agree to the stiffening as mentioned in the letter and re-iterated that he has no intention of laying-up the ship for stiffening to be carried out.

It now appears that the charter runs to the end of next year but he is quite sure that the Charterers would not allow the ship to lay-off for the time required for stiffening.

The vessel is due in Hamburg mid-November when she will dry-dock for painting only or failing that mid-December. Mr. Friederich stated he would reply to your letter and further that he expects to be in Hamburg next week when he hoped he might give you a call to discuss the above.
