The remarks of the Chief Ship Surveyor are desired on this case for the consideration of the Classing Committee.

This "Isles" class trawler, built 1941-~~4~~ for the Admiralty and classed #100A- "Stm Trawler" "For Government Service", has been taken over by the War Office on "permanent loan" for the carriage of military equipment and personnel with a civilian crew on board.

It is now desired that the vessel be transferred to the Register Book as a fully classed ship.

The LONDON Surveyors report the vessel placed in dry dock, the requirements of a SPECIAL SURVEY (B) complied with, and minor repairs effected.

W.T. door fitted to provide communication between engine and boiler rooms.

Asdic gear removed and openings plated over.

The Surveyors report considerable alterations carried out in way of accommodation spaces: none of these however affect the vessel's class.

It is submitted the vessel is eligible to have her class #100A- "~~Stm Trawler~~" "For Government Service" transferred to the Register Book, with record of docking survey 9.47 and the notation 'S.S. Lon. - 9.47', as recommended, assigned.
